Dear Mr. Muilenburg,

We have been made aware of a letter sent to you by our Democrat Colleagues which is intended to pressure you to abdicate The Boeing Company's protected rights with concern to Boeing South Carolina. Notably, none of these signatories represent any portion of South Carolina.

We, democratically elected Representatives for South Carolina, have serious concerns with this letter and urge you to continue to respect the overwhelming vote cast by Boeing South Carolina teammates to not unionize in February 2017.

This letter, like the August 29<sup>th</sup>, 2018 letter from 23 Democrat Senators, is inappropriate and clearly does not have the best interests in mind of South Carolina residents, employers, and the workers at the Boeing South Carolina facility in question – who we represent.

As you are aware, this disputed micro-unit is under an active appeal before the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB). The NLRB's December 2017 *PCC Structural's* decision makes such bargaining units unlawful and thus makes a review of this micro-unit by the NLRB appropriate and necessary.

Under the National Labor Relations Act (NLRA), The Boeing Company, or any party subject to NLRB jurisdiction (including petitioning employees), has a clearly defined right to appeal the certification of a bargaining unit. This protected right, and indeed all protected rights under the NLRA, must be respected and directing an employer to forgo its NLRA rights is as improper as directing employees to do the same.

South Carolina has attracted world class businesses such as Boeing, BMW, Volvo, General Electric, Michelin, Bridgestone, and many others who provide high paying skilled jobs for our residents and invest billions of dollars annually into our economy and into small and medium sized businesses here. We have accomplished this by creating an excellent business environment driven by a truly world-class workforce. South Carolinians do not need politicians from the

other side of the country telling them what is best for them or for the employers who are increasingly calling South Carolina home due to a warm business environment.


We can't stress enough how inappropriate it is for an individual representing special interests in Washington State to attempt to interfere with employment outcomes in South Carolina.

We stand with our constituents, including the vast majority of Boeing South Carolina employees who voted against unionizing, in supporting your legal right to appeal what is an unlawful and inappropriate micro-unit.




