
Students selected as district 1<sup>st</sup> place winners in the 2011 Congressional Arts Competition may be eligible to receive a US\$1,500 per year admission scholarship to SCAD, should they apply and be accepted. Accepted students may be eligible for additional admission scholarships based on GPA and SAT or ACT scores, portfolio submission, audition, riding or writing submissions. Scholarships are limited and are awarded to the earliest qualifiers. Students entering in the fall are encouraged to apply and submit required scholarship materials by Feb. 15.

Students may also be eligible for scholarships from alternative sources and funding from a variety of lending institutions. United States citizens and resident aliens may be eligible for applicable federal and state aid.

The Savannah College of Art and Design is a private, nonprofit, accredited institution conferring bachelor's and master's degrees to prepare talented students for professional careers.
